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MESSAGE

It is my proud privilege to have served this premier higher education institution as Principal for the last seven years. My aim is to make this college a centre of higher education that is dedicated to nation-building. The need of the hour is holistic education. I have made especial efforts to ensure the welfare of students and other stakeholders from the underprivileged classes and minorities, and that of our female students in particular.

I am delighted to announce that the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has awarded Ramananda College a B++ grade with a CGPA of 2.83 in 2021. This is the result of the third cycle of assessment of the college—a stage to which very few higher education institutions in West Bengal have progressed so quickly. This excellent rating is an affirmation of our college's excellence, and I hope that it will inspire us to work harder and take the college to greater heights in future. I thank each and every one of the stakeholders of the college for the effort they put in to ensure the success of this assessment.



During this year, we continued to meet the challenges presented to the educational system caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. We have organized a vaccination programme for students who were unable to obtain it on their own. We have improved our online learning delivery methods and continued to encourage virtual studying. We have tried our best to ensure that students have not suffered in terms of their studies, and also tracked their progress effectively through timely evaluations and assessments. The college has further developed its online platform for teaching and learning activities. Our faculty members are utilising various platforms to communicate satisfactorily with students, and have already completed the syllabi of the even semester on time. The IQAC of this institution has created an easily accessible online library of e-content and model questions for students and faculty members. Many of our departments have organized national and international-level webinars and online lecture series.

We are now looking forward to fully implementing a blended system of education as recommended by the University Grants Commission. With the resumption of in-person classes in November 2021, we have been not only been teaching students in classrooms, but also helping them get re-accustomed to classroom-based learning—especially those who had not entered a school or college classroom in the past two years. At the same time, we are continuing to use electronic and online teaching-learning methods more effectively so that students receive the best of both worlds.

The lifting of pandemic-related restrictions enabled to restart our annual cycle of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. We could hold our annual College Sports in 2022, after a gap of nearly two years. We also conducted an intra-college Drama Competition, as well as the Annual Exhibition. Many of our students have performed well in sports and other extra-curricular activities. I am very proud of the fact that our student Panchu Duley was selected for the national U-19 Football Team in 2021.

In the academic year 2021-22, 16 students of our college (a record-breaking number) have qualified in the NET, SET and GATE examinations. I wish them all the best for their future.

Finally, in June 2022, we could organize the first-ever Legal Aid Camp in association with the college's Alumni Association, which saw the participation of district-level, sub-divisional, and local judges and law enforcement officials.

I would like to express my gratitude to Mr. Arup Chakraborty, Member, West Bengal Legislative Assembly, who is the President of the Governing Body of this college, for always encouraging, advising, and helping me to lead the college properly. I also thank other members of the Governing Body for cooperating with me in the administrative work of the college. CAMPUS CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Ramananda College, Bishnupur, Bankura

1. Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and behave in a dignified manner both inside as well as outside the College campus. They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the College and should act in a way that highlights the strict discipline and the excellent reputation of the College.
2. All the students are expected to be present in the class well within time. Students shall rise from their seats when the teacher enters the class room and remain standing till the teacher takes her/his seat or they are allowed by the teacher to sit. Silence shall be observed during class hours. No student shall enter or leave the class room while a class is in progress without the permission of the teacher concerned.
3. Teachers shall be greeted appropriately with "Good Morning Sir/Madam" or "Good Afternoon Sir/Madam" when they enter the class room and a "Thank you Sir/Madam" when the teacher leaves the class room.
4. All students shall leave the classes immediately after the classes are over. No students shall wander or gather in the verandah, corridors, staircases, etc. They should not spend much time in canteens, coffee shops, etc.
5. All the students are expected to attend college functions, seminars, and conferences, and remain present for the entirety of all such events.
6. All the students must wear their identity cards, which should be properly displayed. The identity card is a public document and all teaching staff and non-teaching staff have the right to examine it. Denial of that alone will invite disciplinary action.
7. All kinds of tattooing, body piercing, hair styling, etc. that go against existing social norms will be referred to the Disciplinary Committee. Any dress code violations noticed within the campus will initiate further disciplinary action.
8. Students are expected to maintain silence in the academic buildings to maintain decorum. Any deviant behaviour such as hooting, whistling, loitering, etc. will be treated as instances of indiscipline.
9. For independent study, students are expected to use the class rooms, the library or the demarcated areas of the academic buildings. They shall not resort to sitting on staircases or other areas where they could interfere with the free movement of others.
10. Students are encouraged to make use of the library, the common computing facilities and to involve themselves in professional body activities and programmes authorized by the college beyond class hours. However, under normal circumstances students shall return to their hostels or residences by 6 p.m.
11. Students are expected to keep the campus neat and clean. They should not put any waste anywhere in the campus except in the waste baskets/bins.
12. Consumption of intoxicants or psychotropic substances in any form, smoking, or using chewing gum, *pan masala*, etc. are strictly prohibited inside the campus.
13. It is strongly advised to refrain from activities such as scribbling or noting on walls, doors or furniture, which could damage the college and destroy the academic ambience.
14. Students are advised to be very careful while handling the furniture, equipment, fixtures and appliances of the college and laboratories. Careless handling or misuse of these objects could result in physical injuries or damage to property. Follow safety precautions near moving machines and electrical installations. In the event of damage of property, the responsible students will have to bear the cost of replacement/repair along with a fine.
15. Students are not permitted to arrange any unauthorized celebrations and decorations of any kind in the campus.
16. Students are not permitted to distribute or display (both physically and electronically) material such as notices, banners, or similar material inside the campus without the permission of the competent authority.
17. Students are expected to make use of the academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular facilities available as much as possible. This will make them physically fit, academically competent, mentally alert, and socially sensitive.
18. Students who intend to represent the college in inter-collegiate events shall take prior permission from the concerned head of the department. The selection of such participants will be based on parameters such as academic performance,

attendance, the character and the competence of the student in the proposed event for participation.

19. Unauthorized meetings, propaganda work, processions, or fund collections are forbidden within the college, the hostels, the college grounds, and the approach roads.
20. Harassing juniors, ill-treatment of fellow students, or any form of ragging is objectionable and liable to be treated as a criminal offence by law enforcement agencies as per the directives of the Supreme Court of India.
21. Misbehaviour with women students or the use of threats or violence against members of the staff or fellow students will be considered to be very serious cases of misconduct.
22. Any violation of the rules stated here will invite penalties in the form of warnings, fines, summoning of parents, or any corrective measures found suitable by any staff member or the higher authority of the college.
23. **Mobile Phone Policy:** The purpose of this policy is to establish clear-cut guidelines regarding the usage of mobile phones inside the campus. This policy is applicable to students who enter the college campus. Realizing the importance of communication and the possible impact of mobile phone usage inside the campus, the following guidelines have been prescribed:

(i) Students are not permitted to use mobile phones without just cause within the campus. However, the use of phones for academic purposes is allowed if prior permission from a teacher has been taken. Mobile phones must be kept in silent mode during class hours.

(ii) Accessing social networking sites such as Facebook, WhatsApp, Twitter, etc. is prohibited within the college campus. However, access to these sites is permitted in the hostel buildings during time slots specified by the hostel wardens.

AN INTRODUCTION TO OUR COLLEGE

Ramananda College is a pioneering higher-educational institution located in Bishnupur, in the district of Bankura. It is the sole co-educational degree college with PG courses recognized by the UGC within the town of Bishnupur. Since its inception in 1945, this institution has been serving the cause of higher education in the local community and also of students from remote villages. Even today, students from other districts study here.

Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, a freedom-fighter and social worker of Bishnupur, Sri Radhagobinda Roy, the founder-principal of this college and a former minister in the Government of West Bengal, and other eminent community members of Bishnupur decided to establish this college here. Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, the Koley family, Sri Anil Kumar Bhattacharya, members of the Friends' Union Club, and the community provided almost the entirety of the funds used to build this college. The college is named after a son of the soil, Sri Ramananda Chattopadhyay (1865-1943), a journalist, editor, and scholar who was active during the Bengal Renaissance.

Initially, the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta, and later to the University of Burdwan. Since 1st January 2017, it has been affiliated to Bankura University. The college is recognized by the UGC under Sections 2F and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956. As the college was established before Independence, it predates the creation of the UGC as well as that of the University of Burdwan. In 2015, during the college's second assessment cycle, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) re-accredited the College with a score of 2.75. Furthermore, with the introduction of different Post-Graduate courses in Science and Humanities subjects, the college has become a constituent college of Bankura University. The college is also compliant with the vision and mission of RUSA.

VISION AND MISSION OF THE COLLEGE

The vision of Ramananda College is to provide an innovative academic ambience, best standards, healthy practices, opportunities, and experiences that enable individuals, communities, and society as a whole to thrive, develop, and prosper. This institution of higher education is open to all irrespective of caste, creed, religion, or gender. Since its inception in 1945, the institution has been marching forward to become a centre of excellence for higher education, with the motto, “Sraddhabana Lavate Gyanam”.

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INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE COLLEGE

- **College Campus:** Our College is a partially residential one with a total campus area of 37,635.82 sq.m. Apart from the main building of the college and other academic blocks housing different departments, the college campus contains three students' hostels, a spacious auditorium ("Biram Bhavan"), a museum, a playground, a students' health home, the office of the Students' Union and staff quarters. There are two canteens within the college premises for teachers, students, and non-teaching staff. The college has modernized toilet blocks, a gymnasium, cycle stands, students' common rooms (separate ones for boys and girls), gardens (for flowers & medicinal plants), CCTV surveillance facility, a computerized library, and an office with Internet facilities.
- **Hostels:** We have three hostels (one for boys, one for girls, and a *Swabalambi Chhatrabas*, a boys' hostel for poor and meritorious students) with a total seat capacity of 175. Superintendents look after these hostels. Healthcare services are also provided through the Students' Health Home.
- **Library:** The library is located on the ground floor with a separate reading room for students and teachers. The library is well-ventilated and brightly lit to facilitate comfortable usage. The library is fully computerized, thus making operations like the issuing of books, their return, OPAC searching, and the availability assessment of books easy and user-friendly. We have bar-coded our document collections. Our college library contains a rich collection of more than 30000 books, 23 journals/magazines, 3 daily newspapers, and 2 employment-oriented newspapers. Our library subscribes to 2 digital databases: one from N-LIST (UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium, INFLIBNET Centre), and the other through the NDL (National Digital Library, IIT Kharagpur). Library books are arranged in accordance with the Dewey Decimal Classification System. Library membership is offered to current students and staff of the college. We have now installed the KOHA open-source integrated library management system.
- **Laboratories:** All practical-based departments have well-equipped laboratories for the Honours and General practical classes. These laboratories are kept up to date on a regular basis according to the changing syllabi. A separate laboratory for a PG Department (Botany) is maintained. The college also has a Central Instrumentation Facility with a number of modern and scientific instruments. A new computer laboratory for the Mathematics Department has been established.
- **Computers, Internet Facilities and Other Modern Teaching Aids:** At present, there are 162 computers and laptops are distributed in the office, library, and academic departments. Students, teachers and office staff access the Internet using them. Modern audio-visual teaching aids like LCD projectors, overhead projectors, computerized epidiascopes, etc. are also used in teaching. All academic departments, the office, the library, and the Students' Union office are well connected through intercom telephone services. The college has one virtual class room with teleconferencing facilities with different Universities and colleges. It also has nine smart class rooms. The college has its own website, www.ramanandacollege.org



- **Biodiversity Management Committee:** A Biodiversity Management Committee under the West Bengal Biodiversity Board has been established in the college from the academic session 2018-2019 under the supervision of Dr. Ajit Kumar Datta, Associate Professor of Botany, Ramananda College. In order to make the environment of the college more eco-

friendly, the college observes “No Fuel Day” on the 12th and 25th day of each month.

- **NCC:** The College has a functional NCC unit attached to the 53rd Bengal Battalion. Lieutenant Dr. Deepak Kumar Singh is a full-time Associate NCC Officer (ANO) of the college. NCC training is conducted on Tuesdays. The NCC cadets take part in different types of NCC camps organized by Battalion and Group HQs, as well as diversified activities organized by the college authority.
- **NSS:** Ramananda College currently has two NSS units with two hundred volunteers. Regular NSS activities are organized on Sundays. NSS classes are conducted in the middle of the week within class hours. Every year, NSS volunteers have celebrated and organized various occasions and events in the college campus and in adopted village areas. In 2021-22, one NSS volunteer from the college attended a pre-selection RD camp in Guwahati, Assam.
- **Radha Gobinda Memorial Students' Health Home:** The College has a students' health centre adjacent to the football ground. It is a branch of the Students' Health Home, Kolkata, and the main centre of this administrative sub-division.
- **Other Facilities:** An institutional research grant has been sanctioned to improve the research environment and facilities for teachers and students. A biometric attendance system has been installed for college teachers and non-teaching staff. The college has Special Study Centres/Distance Education Centres of IGNOU and NSOU which offer professional and job-oriented programmes along with conventional courses. The college also serves as a unit of the Direct Distance A rainwater harvesting project has been started with financial help from the Environment Science Department, Government of West Bengal, to provide water for the students of the Swabalambi Hostel. There are four electrical generator sets in the campus if emergencies arise. A solar-power lighting system has also been installed in the college. Selected students are provided with sports goods for participation in inter-university and state-level competitions. The college has a well-equipped gymnasium-hall and the “Annasatra” scheme for feeding indigent students. Very recently, five PG courses in Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Botany, and Mathematics have been introduced in our college, and they are now running smoothly.



❑ New Initiatives in 2021-22 (Already Completed)

1. The college canteen has been fully renovated with funds obtained from RUSA.
2. Programmes to improve social health awareness and personal hygienic awareness by the COVID Cell of our college.

ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND RESULTS

Teachers possessing the qualifications mandated by the University Grants Commission (UGC) are appointed through the West Bengal College Service Commission (WBCSC). Along with the non-teaching staff, they are engaged in serving the college. State-Aided College Teachers have also been appointed to meet the needs of the students. Every year, some students obtain University ranks and a good number of them secure First Classes in the university examinations. In the last academic session (2020-2021), 10 Honours students obtained an “Outstanding” grade, in the University Final UG Examinations, while 66 Honours students and 23 Programme students secured an “Excellent” grade. In addition, 14 post-graduate students also achieved an “Excellent” grade in the University Final PG Examinations. Department-wise results are listed in this table.

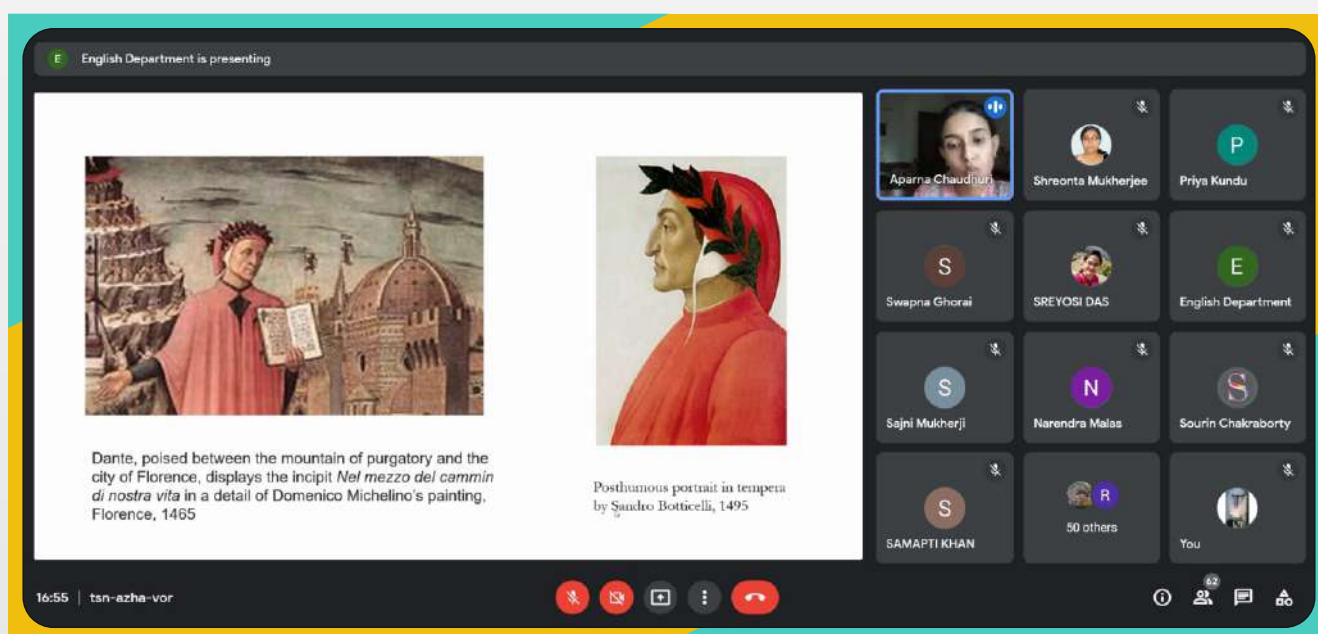

OTHER ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Apart from regular teaching and ongoing assessment activities, a number of faculty members are engaged in academic research. Some of them have been invited by other institutions and research organizations as resource persons to deliver lectures on selected topics. Different departments of the college organize seminars (State and National Level) and workshops. In the 2020-21 academic session, teachers of this college published 33 research papers in national and international journals and participated in various workshops and seminars, including international seminars. For the students and teachers of the Humanities and Social Sciences departments, there is a Study Circle, *Bikshan*. For the students and teachers of Science departments, there is an organization, *Vigyan Parishad*, in the college. The Women Cell and Sexual Harassment Prevention Cell play active roles in the college. Under the newly functional Career Advancement Centre (CAC), the college provides coaching for entry in services to SC, ST, OBC, and minority students. Students can also avail of Remedial Coaching in addition to regular classroom teaching. Spoken English classes have also been started and will be continued under the Career Advancement Centre. A Certificate Course in computer literacy and proficiency has been started from 2019.

❑ Extra-Curricular Activities during 2021–22:

We were able to resume certain extra-curricular activities, primarily from 2022. The college conducted an online Cultural Programme in January 2022, with students sending in recordings of music, dance, and elocution performances. In March 2022, it conducted an Annual Drama Competition. Finally, in April 2022, it organized a two-day Annual Exhibition, where different departments competed against each other to create the best exhibits on their chosen themes.

Our students have also participated in programmes outside the college. From 12th May 2022 to 14th May 2022, some of our students from various Science departments participated in the “Bangla Unnayaner Pathe” exhibition organized by the Bishnupur Municipality. Their exhibits were greatly appreciated.

Sadananda Kumbhakar (UG, Department of Zoology) was awarded the 1st position for poster presentation in a National Seminar on Bio-Diversity Conservation organized by Bankura Sammilani College, Bankura.

❑ Career Advancement Centre

The Career Advancement Centre (CAC) started its journey in 2016 with the aim of training students to develop their professional skills for different competitive examinations, providing information to students regarding the different courses they could opt for after graduation, and letting students know about job opportunities in different spheres. Many of our students have been recruited to government jobs in the RPF, BSF, SSC, WBCSC, WBCS, WBPS, etc. It has also organized two grooming programmes with (i) Gillette Guard in association with Anandabazar Patrika and (ii) RICE Education. Six candidates were selected for jobs by Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) through Academia-Industry Interaction in the academic year 2018–2019.

In 2021-22, the Career Advancement Centre conducted these programmes:

- “Uttaran : An Initiative For Competitive Examinations”, organized in association with the Bishnupur S.D.O., on 06.10.2021. This was a one-day workshop on career counselling. Interested students were asked to appear in a test, and the top 50 students in terms of scores were offered free coaching for various civil service entrance examinations.
- A screening test for WBCS/IAS/IPS in collaboration with Satyendranath Tagore Civil Services Study Centre was held on 20.11.2021. 182 students participated in this programme.
- The Affirmative Action Training Programme is imparted by TCS. It is one of their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) projects. In it, students are given free TCS employability training for 100 hours, followed by a written test and personal interview.



Under this employability training, they focus on those students who have graduated or are in their final year of study, and who do not belong to financially sound families. They mainly focus on ST, SC and OBC students from a rural background. Through this training, many students have been placed in jobs and are well-settled now. A CSR training programme with Ankur Bikash Kendra and Bishnupur Nagarik Mancha took place in January 2019. The Youth Employment Program (YEP) stems from the Tata Affirmative Action Program (TAAP) under the CSR umbrella and has been driven since 2011 addressing the challenge of unemployment within India. TCS believes that given the right opportunities and learning skills, even those from socially and economically under-privileged families, will be able to showcase their potential, join the mainstream economy, and shall have a dignified life. The program aims at providing Free Employability Training for the SC/ST and other economically weaker candidates. From 20.11.2021, 192 students of Ramananda College have been receiving this training from TCS.

- An Awareness Lecture on Recruitment as airmen in the Indian Air Force was held on 04.12.2021. 105 students attended the programme. The lectures were delivered by officers and non-commissioned officers of the 4th ASC, Barrackpore, West Bengal.
- A “Workshop-cum-Training Programme for Upcoming Staff Selection Programme” was organized on 12.03.2022 in collaboration with RICE Education, Medinipur, where students were given advice by Soumya Banerjee (Manager, Academic Operations) and Sujay Kumar Das (Expert Teacher, Mathematics) about how to prepare for various competitive examinations.
- A “Seminar and Mock Test” was organized on 26.05.2022 in collaboration with Unacademy with a focus on the upcoming WBPSA entrance examination.
- A campus recruitment drive where Svatantra Microfin Pvt. Ltd, an Aditya Birla Group company, visited the

EXPANSION & DIVERSIFICATION

We have plans to introduce job-oriented vocational courses in the near future; the CAC is a step in that direction. A new computer centre, language labs, smart classrooms and conventional classrooms have been constructed under the RUSA grant. Our institution has launched seven certificate courses affiliated to Bankura University: Communicative English and Personality Development, Computer Training, Cutting/Knitting, Food Processing, Modern Handicrafts, Travel and Tourism, and Yoga. These courses will enrich the learners with some vocational training for generating a sustained income. Honours courses in Computer Science and Music have been started from the 2018–2019 session. All PG students of this College will be able to receive coaching for the NET, SET and SSC Examinations along with their PG Studies from our institute. A solar-powered lighting system has also been installed.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The alumni of Ramananda College formed the Ramananda Mahavidyalaya Praktan Chhatra Samiti (Ramananda College Alumni Association) in 1996. The Samiti was formally registered in 2001. The Samiti has been provided office space within the college campus, where the Golden Jubilee “Smarakkakhya” has already been constructed. The Alumni Association regularly funds and conducts activities in the college for the betterment of current students and other stakeholders.

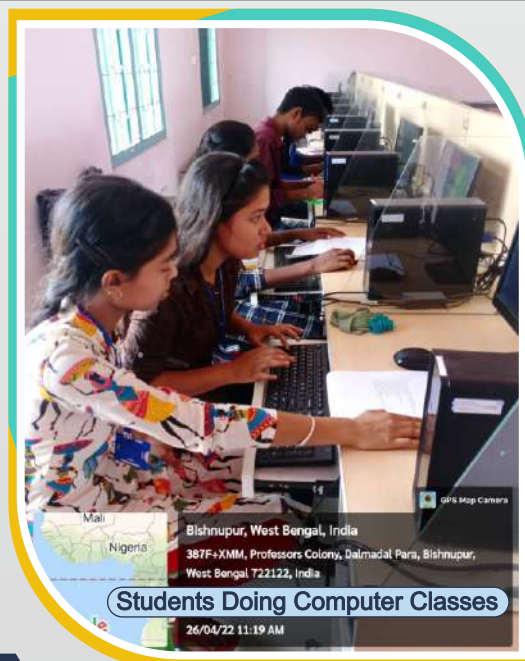

Important Intructions:

1. Geography at the H.S. level is mandatory in order to opt for Geography in the B.Sc. / B.A. General Degree course.
2. Students who have studied vocational courses at the Plus-2 level are eligible for subject-specific General Degree courses. Students who have qualified from Rabindra Open University (technical courses) are eligible for candidature in different subjects according to the University guidelines.
3. Students belonging to the SC / ST / OBC / PH / VH categories will be considered as per the Govt. guidelines.

4. The Principal's decision regarding matters of admission is final. In all matters related to the admission procedure, the latest notice issued by the University will be considered final.
5. Students who have qualified in the H.S. this year, along with H.S.-qualified students from the last two years, are eligible for admission in the first semester. All students except for those who have qualified this year will have to mention their previous institution and provide valid transfer and registration certificates before admission. Those who have not been admitted to a college in the previous years will have to provide satisfactory proof. Guardians are required to sign an undertaking.
6. All other important notifications will be available on the college notice board.

- iii. B.A. Programme with Physical Education as General subject: Minimum marks in aggregate: 30%.

9. Eligible students are required to contact the concerned authorities with a proper income certificate to apply for concessions.

10. No application for change of subject(s) will be entertained after registration/enrollment at the University.

11. Admission to the M.A. / M.Sc. Course is solely done by the University.

12. Attested photocopies of these documents should be attached with the application form:

- a. Marksheets of the last examination in which the student has passed,
- b. Registration certificate of the Class 12 (Higher Secondary or Other Boards) Examination
- c. Marksheets of the Class 10 (Madhyamik or Other Boards) Examination
- d. the Admit Card of the Madhyamik (Class 10) Examination
- e. the School Leaving Certificate
- f. the Caste Certificate (if applicable)
- g. the PH/VH Certificate (if applicable), and
- h. an original copy of a Declaration on Stamp Paper duly signed by the Student and the Guardian.

All original documents should be produced during verification.

13. All students should collect a photo identity card from the college after admission.

14. There will be Internal Assessments in every semester and the marks of these assessments will be added to the marks of



each End Semester Examination.

15. According to University Guidelines, students should have 75% attendance and should appear in all the Internal Examinations conducted by the college to be eligible to appear at the University examinations or apply for student concessions or scholarships.
16. Students should regularly follow the college notice board for information and fill up forms for registration and enrolment within the due dates to be eligible to appear in the University examinations.
17. The college has NCC and NSS units. Students should register their name through applications to the respective offices.
18. In case of irregular attendance and other disciplinary matters, the college might notify guardians and request them to visit the college.
19. Any complaint of ragging in the college campus or college hostel premises will be strictly dealt with using proper legal procedures.
20. Students should follow the college notice board for notifications about the submission of fees.



Regarding Students' Hostels:

There are separate hostels for boys and girls. Every hostel has a superintendent in charge.

1. Capacity of Boys' Hostel: 100
2. Capacity of Girls' Hostel: 75

Approximate Expenditure for Staying in Hostels:

The hostel seat rent per month is Rs.250/- (for 12 months, i.e., an academic session running from July to June). The seat rent for the Swabalambi Hostel is Rs. 125/- per month. It should be noted that only economically poor but meritorious students can avail the seats in the Swabalambi Hostel. Every student has to bear the monthly electricity bill along with the monthly meal charge at the end of the month, failing which the college authority will bears no responsibility for electricity disconnection.

Hostel Admission Fees and Rules:

Every boarder has to pay Rs.200/- as admission fee, and Rs. 3000/- as seat rent for 12 months at the time of admission. However, Rs. 200/- as admission fee and Rs.1500/- as seat rent will be payable for staying in the Swabalambi Hostel. The mess management in hostels rests with the Mess Committees elected by the boarders themselves.

Seat allotments for hostels are at the Principal's sole discretion. Guests of any boarder can stay and avail of food in hostels only with the prior permission of the Principal. The superintendents' directions are always in force in the management of hostels. Breaches/violations of rules and regulations regarding hostels will attract severe punishment. Any incident of ragging will result in harsh punishment. The full cooperation of parents/guardians is solicited.

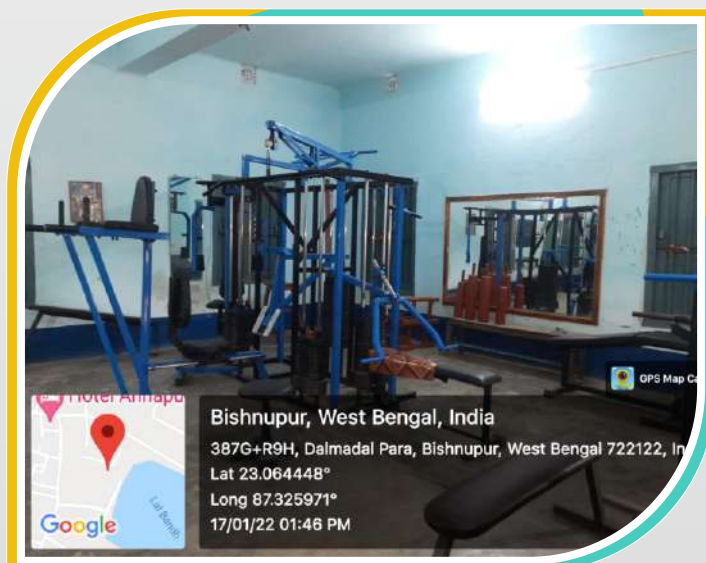
